_____BURLARY_____ PUBLIC ASSISTANCE REQUESTED

"In the past few days, the Sheriff's office has responded to and investigated some residential burglaries in the Radnor and Flora areas of the county. These crimes have been occurring during daylight hours, encompassing the general hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. At this time, the only, possible suspect vehicle descriptions we have, are a blue colored, 4 door passenger car and a black colored, full sized pick up truck, acting suspicious in the area. Deputies have combed these areas but have not located these vehicles. Obviously, individuals participating in criminal acts can and do switch vehicles frequently and are frequently mobile, searching about in various portions of our county and neighboring counties.

A basic, common sense message we want to extend to our community in an effort to "help us, help you" is to remember to secure your homes and properties. Please lock doors, lock windows. Consider a security system. Most are relatively inexpensive any more. We are not in a position to recommend or endorse a specific system. Be vigilant in observing suspicious activity which may be observed in your neighborhood. Above all, report anything which just doesn't look "right" for your area. It can be frustrating for us when we learn community members may have seen something and either chose not to report it or, as we've heard previously, "didn't want to bother us." My reply is this. We work and serve you. Bother us! I would much rather follow up on a report of a suspicious person or vehicle report and find it is legitimate activity or has nothing to do with what we are investigating versus finding out days or weeks later and learn it may have been the "break" we were looking for. Our community is our additional "eyes and ears" and we value your information. The simple comment of "See It, Report It" is important to us. Thank you for all you do for us. With your continued assistance, we WILL continue to make Carroll County a safe and great place to live, work, and raise a family. Thank you."
